Tracey Curro (MC)

Tracey is a former 60 Minutes reporter, Al Gore Climate Change Ambassador and an accomplished businesswoman and corporate communication expert. She has over 20

Kim Williams AM

Kim Williams has had a long involvement in the arts, entertainment and media industries and has held various executive leadership and board positions since the late 1970s. He was the chief

executive of FOXTEL for the decade up until November 2011. He was appointed as a member in the Order of Australia in June 2006 for his services to the arts and public policy formulation in the film and television industries.



Hon, Steve Herbert MP

Steve Herbert joined the Australian Labor Party and embarked upon a political career from 1990, working in senior advisory roles with both state and federal governments. Steve

was elected as a Member of Parliament representing the Eltham electorate from December 2002 to 2014. In the 2014 election, Steve was elected as a Member of the Legislative Council in the seat of the Northern Victoria Region and was sworn in as Minister for Training and Skills.



Dr David Collins CBE

David Collins has had a long and distinguished career in further education in the United Kingdom, having been the Principal of South Cheshire College for more than 15 years, the first

President of the Association of Colleges, the Chief Executive of Learning and Skills Improvement Service, and since November of last year, the first Further Education Commissioner. He is the author of two books, as well as numerous articles on quality improvement in colleges and was appointed CBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours list in 2005.



Maria Peters

Maria Peters is CEO of Chisholm Institute. She has extensive experience in vocational education within Victoria and internationally. Maria has led significant educational innovation

within the VET sector aimed at improving participation and ensuring strong student and industry outcomes. She has been at the forefront of effective organisational change and management in the TAFE sector.
