

About the VTA

The Victorian TAFE Association Inc. (VTA) is the peak body for Victorian TAFE Network, which comprises Victoria's 12 TAFE institutes and four dual sector universities. The VTA was established in January 1999 as a result of a merger between the former Association of TAFE Institutes (ATI) and the Victorian Association of TAFE Directors (VICAD). We represent the sector in dealings with government, industry and community stakeholders; harness and develop the collective capacity of the network; and facilitate collaboration between members.

As the peak body, the VTA liaises with government at state and federal levels on issues affecting Victoria's TAFE institutes and dual sector universities, consulting with members and advocating on their behalf to government reviews related to the vocational education and training (VET) sector.

The VTA supports and provides its resources to over 20 communities of practice and member networks, such as HR Managers, Marketing Managers, Educational Leaders, Community and Industry Engagement Network, and Victorian TAFE International, a community of practice for VET managers who work in international education.

Did You Know?

TAFE educates and trains 200,000+ students every year.

TAFE has 90+ campuses.

TAFE provides a gateway to education for all Victorians, with at least a third of all students in TAFE from low socio-economic backgrounds

Over 70 per cent of apprentices gain their training through Victoria's TAFE institutes

TAFE provides education and training to about 65 per cent of all Victoria's Indigenous VET students.

TAFE provides education across the Australian qualifications spectrum, from VCE through to Masters level courses.

TAFE educates about 6,000 senior secondary students, providing a pathway for students who struggle in traditional school settings.

TAFE provides education and training that enables older Victorians to up-skill or re-enter the workforce, with about 340,000 Victorians aged over 25 benefiting from training delivered by TAFE institutes.

TAFE delivers education and training internationally with many close links in the Asia-Pacific region.
