**Victorian TAFE Association welcomes announcement of new  
Victorian Skills Authority Advisory Board**

The Victorian TAFE Association (VTA), the peak body for Victoria's public VET providers, has welcomed the announcement by the State Government of the new Victorian Skills Authority Advisory Board.

Of note is the appointment of Lisa Line as chair of the Advisory Board. Ms Line was previously the Chief Executive Officer of The Gordon, and was most recently Swinburne University of Technology's Deputy Vice Chancellor, Pathways and Vocational Education. She brings to the role deep experience of vocational education and training, and skills issues, both in Australia and internationally.

The announcement of the Advisory Board follows the establishment of the Victorian Skills Authority itself, which was stood-up by the Government following the release earlier in the year of the *Skills for Victoria's Growing Economy Review* (Macklin Review), which made a series of recommendations including the establishment of a new body, "to act as a champion and steward of the skills system."

Importantly, the Authority will lead the development of an annual Skills Plan, which will provide for future skills planning and priorities.

High-level discussions between the Victorian Skills Authority and the VTA have already been positive and have underlined the critical role that the twelve standalone TAFE institutes and four dual sector universities play each day in providing quality vocational education and training across Victoria.
