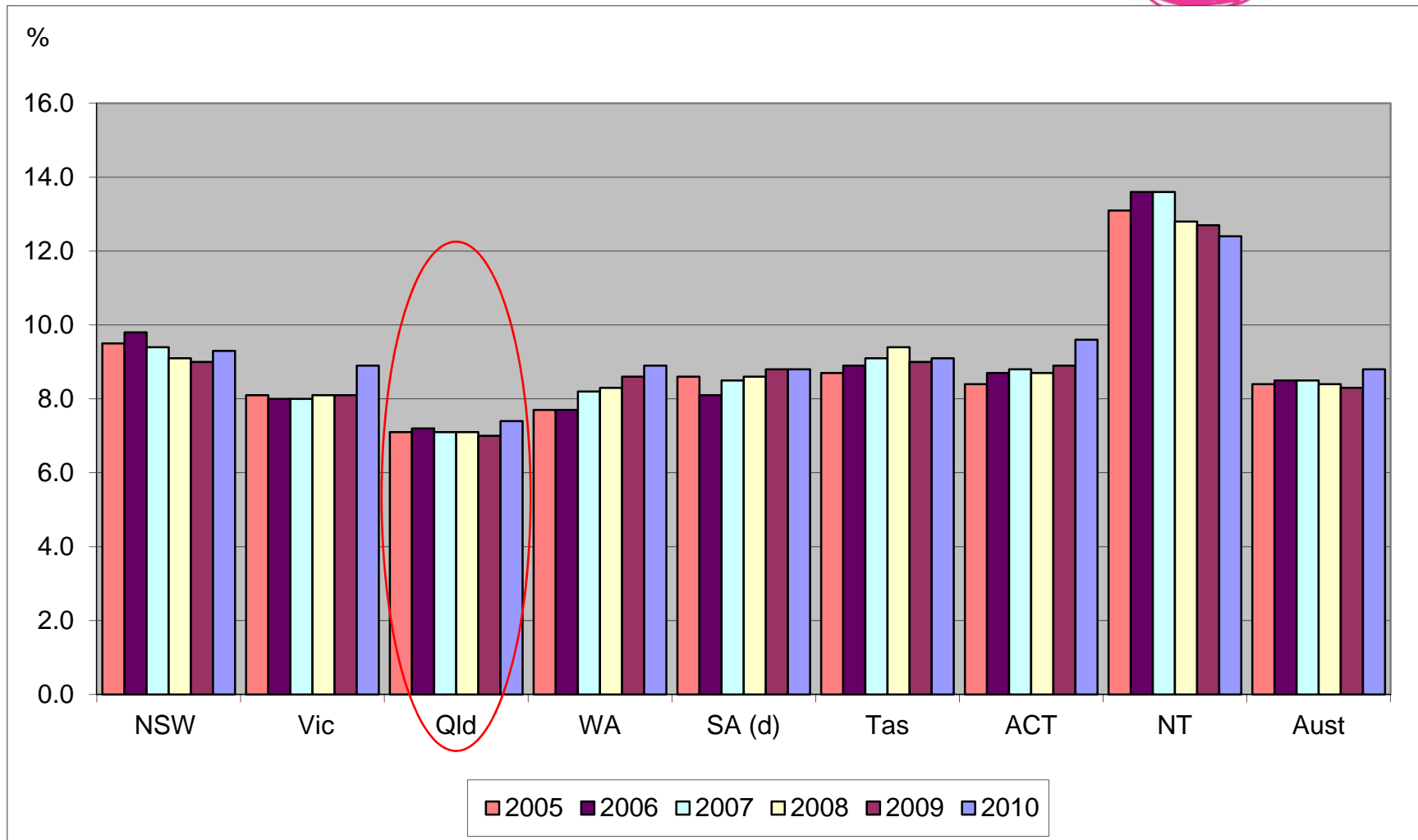

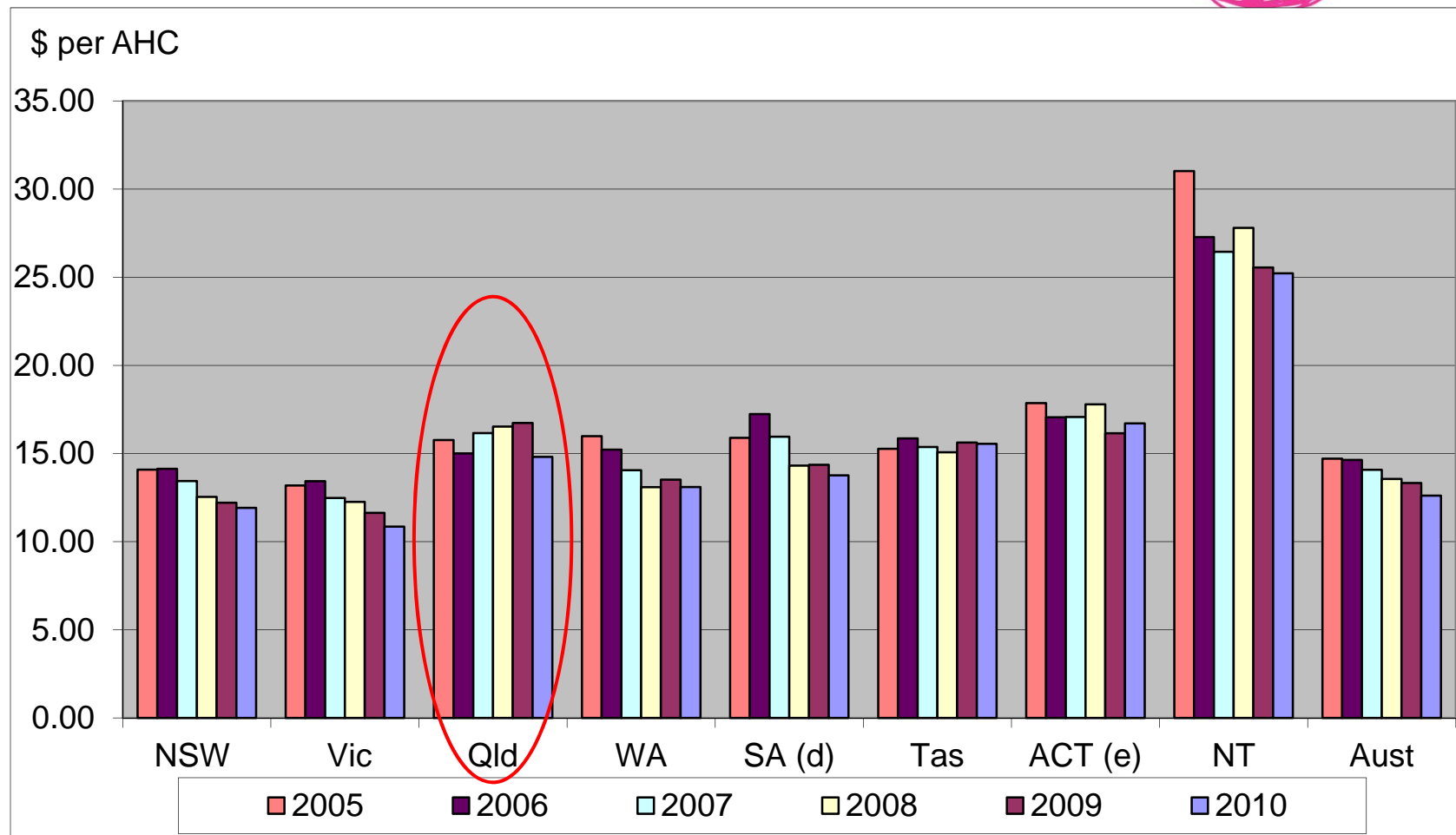
QUEENSLAND'S VET MARKET

- Approximately 1530 registered training providers
- 283,300 publicly funded VET students in 2010/11
- 212,400 publicly funded TAFE students in 2010/11 ~75%
- 68.7% of 2010/11 (PF) enrolments were at Cert III and above
- Of 119,561 qualification completions in 2010/11 over 62% were at Cert III and above.

VET Participation - All 15 to 64 Aged Students

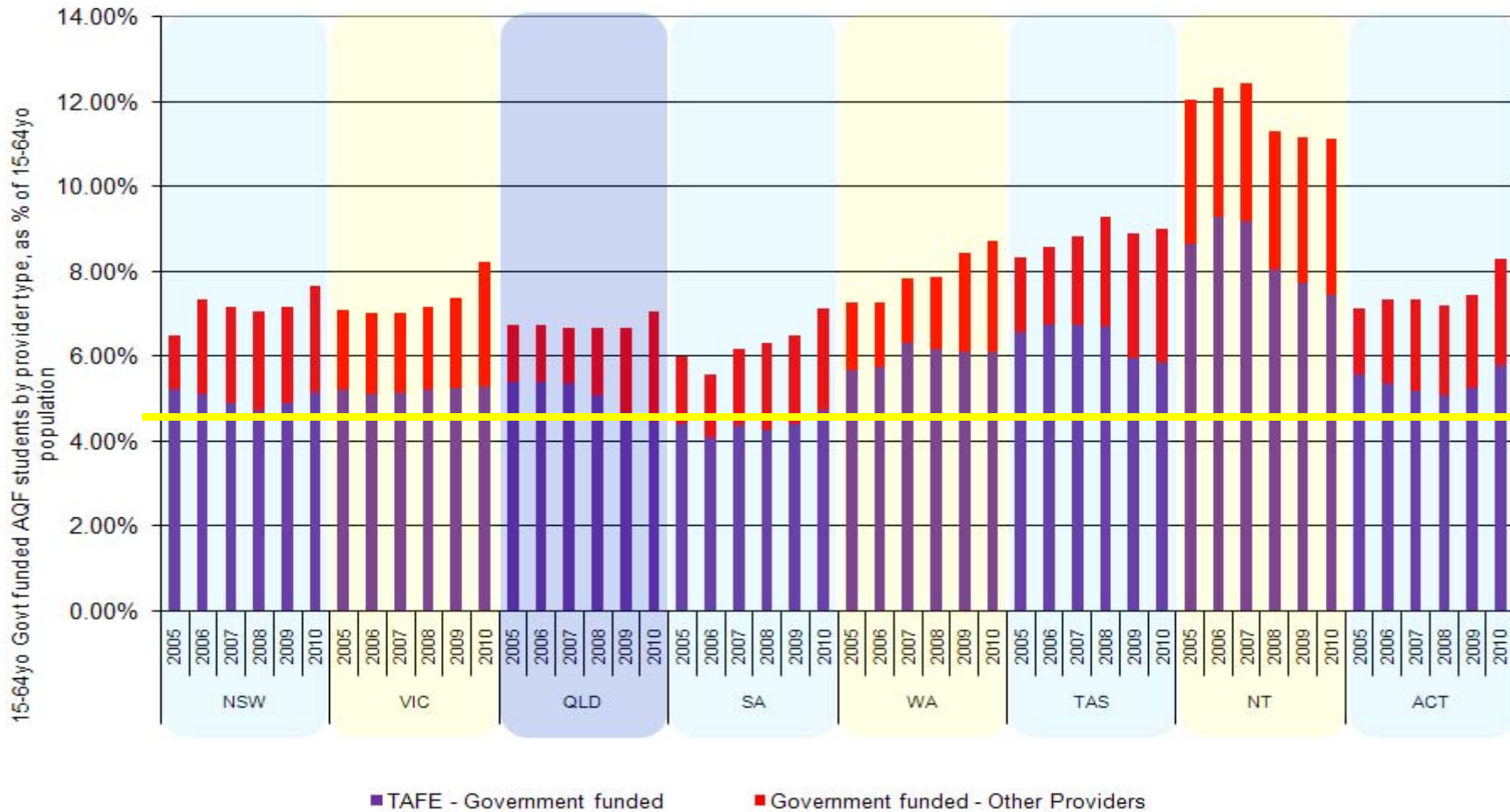


Government Real Recurrent Expenditure per AHC (2010 dollars - \$ per hour)
